The Parish Council has agreed to fund two additional dog bins in the village. These have been situated near the Newsagents and the footpath that leads from the main road to the Foxbridge Estate.

In addition the District Council is going to provide some statutory notices that warn people that non compliance with the existing by-laws that prohibit dog fouling will also be put up.

We are also sourcing some posters that we will put up in the worst affected areas. In the meantime if you want to help, the Newsagents has a supply of the sticker below which you are welcome to display appropriately. Please do not put these stickers up in or on property that does not belong to you.

Faster Broadband has Arrived !

Yes - superfast Fibre Optic Broadband has arrived in Hunston with the capacity for properties in the village to have access to download speeds ranging from 40Mbps up to 80Mbps depending on your location and which package you choose.

The new green fibre optic cabinet has been installed and is ready for accepting connections. You can find out what speeds are available for your property at www.dslchecker.bt.com Residents are advised to check with their Internet Provider for full details of packages that are available.

Avoiding Scams and hoaxes

Scam and hoax websites and emails are designed to trick you into disclosing personal information such as bank account details, passwords or credit card numbers.

Scam emails are also often used to con you into paying money for fake get-rich-quick offers, prize or lottery wins or fraudulent or poor quality goods.

Be very suspicious of emails from people or businesses you don't know, particularly ones that promise you money, good health or a solution to all your problems. Anything that looks too good to be true usually is. Be suspicious of unexpected emails from your bank or financial institution. Remember banks don't do business via email and never ask for confidential information via email.
